Mr. Wisecarver – I am here for Public Safety – after last night's incident – we had discussed it before – the possibility of a police auxiliary. I wondered if Council might have a work session and actually explore in depth the cost of a police auxiliary and maybe the legality of it. I believe, if there had been another officer in the car with Mr. Schiele, last night that this could possibly have been avoided. I understand that the City budget is in great shape right now to be hiring a lot of police officers. So, I think a police auxiliary could be cost effective. I am asking Council, the Mayor and Public Safety Director if you would consider holding a serious work session and explore this option.

Mayor Zwelling – Everybody is aware of what happened, last night and two good cops in Zanesville got shot – one was Mike Schiele and thank goodness, he has been treated and released. His thoughts the whole time when he was wounded were about Bosco, the other good cop that got shot. That dog is a good policeman and I know how the bond can be between a human being and an animal and I commend Mike Schiele for really worrying about the dog more than taking care of himself. He is at the dog's side, right now and the dog has some paralysis; they are waiting to see if that is temporary or permanent. Our thoughts and prayers are with that dog because that dog has more of a history to it than the average dog; that dog was in the war. Its master was killed and the dog came over and hooked up with the Zanesville Police Department, so that family is suffering this loss, too. They lost a son in the war and this dog was very special to them. Mike Schiele just recently had a death in the family, that he had to go through and now he has got this. Our thoughts and prayers are with him and his family and the dog. Both of them are heroes in my mind. I want to thank the Zanesville Police Department, the defendant has been apprehended; he was caught by the Canton police. I admire the way the Zanesville Police Department handled the situation and commend the Muskingum County Sheriff's Department for backing them up and working with them. When the word is out that a policeman has been shot, it is amazing how everybody gets involved. This defendant is lucky he is in custody because everybody in law enforcement in the United States had a description of him, I guarantee you. Somebody might have taken the law into their own hands. It was a very unfortunate thing and we found out that we have some real heroes in our midst.

Mrs. Gentry – This past Thursday was Lace Up for Kids, that Wendy’s sponsors and United Way. I wanted you to know that women of the pipe liners donated \$1,600 plus shoes and several of them came over and worked with us, getting the shoes out for the children. It was a real pleasure to spend time with the other half and to listen to their stories about their travels and how their families have been second generations of the pipe liners and how much we appreciated them stepping up and coming over and helping out for the day.

Mr. Zakany – The noise factor in the City of Zanesville – I hear cars and the music in the cars is pretty loud. In Columbus they have the same problem; they have more calls on noise in cars, then anything else in Columbus. In Columbus they are writing tickets on noise and they are like us, they have more important things to do.
