



Ordinance No. 09-76 – Introduced by Council – Authorizing the issuance of notes in the amount of not to exceed \$1,128,220 in anticipation of the issuance of bonds for the purpose of repairing and improving the State Street Bridge, constructing, improving and otherwise enhancing Sixth Street, and constructing necessary appurtenances related thereto, retiring notes previously issued for such purpose and declaring an emergency.

Mr. Zakany moved to waive the three readings, seconded by Mr. Tarbert.

#### ORDINANCES FOR ACTION

Ordinance No. 09-69 – Introduced by Council – Authorizing the proper City official to provide funds to the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band as a donation for the presentation of the musical composition, “A Muskingum Portrait”.

Mr. Tarbert moved for second reading, seconded by Mr. Tilton. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 09-71 – An ordinance authorizing the proper City official to enter into a professional contract for engineering design for the Airport Taxiway relocation.

Mr. Zakany moved for second reading, seconded by Mr. Mc Peek. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 09-72 – Introduced by Council – An ordinance authorizing the proper City official to incorporate the new Section 923.28 into the City of Zanesville Codified Ordinances Chapter 923, Sewer Use Regulations.

Mr. Zakany moved for second reading, seconded by Mrs. Gentry.

Petition from: Randy Case, 916 Vine Street, Zanesville

Mr. Case – Looking at the attachment that came with this ordinance and then looking back at 08-126 at the attachment; there has not been much change to this ordinance. The only difference I can see is under Food Service Establishments – you have added a few food service type places.

Mr. Sims – I don’t know how much easier of a program, we could have through the EPA than what this reads. It simply allows for existing facilities to be monitored by the Health Department and/or my Wastewater Treatment Division; then they would be the ones to designate based on the conditions they find what the urgency of testing would be. If there is no problem with the existing system, then there would be no reason to push their maintenance program. If we go quarterly and find problems quarterly, then each and every individual establishment will be handled separately, case by case. Does not say that they would have to put anything in if there was an existing one – all it does is indicate a section about all inside grease interceptors.

Mr. Hennessey – So, we are not mandating ex amount of times a year?



existing light standards are 70 years old. It was told to me that to repair them, they are not safe – it would cost \$78,000 to repair them. They do not put out enough lighting and are not safe to play. Also, this year, we have had lightning strike the poles and it has burned out seven or eight lights in each one of them and they have been repaired by the City. As far as the restrooms go, they are also 70 years old and the drainage does cause us some problems with clogging during the year. The concession would be a great benefit to the Old Timers as we use the money to help pay to manage Gant. In case you did not know, in 2008 we spent in excess of \$33,000 to take care of Gant. If we had concessions, it would go a long way to help cover out costs.

Petition from: Patrick Bollinger, 701 Echo Avenue, Zanesville

Mr. Bollinger – I think Bob Wolfe is a little modest – Bob has put over 50 years into the Muskingum Valley Old Timers Association. I think a lot of people don't realize the time and effort that goes into Gant Municipal Stadium. I think with all the work and effort that goes into this place, I think it would be a shame if the lights went off. I believe we ought to keep what we have and we ought to keep it good.

Petition from: Randy Case, 916 Vine Street, Zanesville

Mr. Case – I don't have a problem with the lights except that I believe that Mr. Sims is applying for stimulus money for it so, if we are applying for stimulus money, we should wait to see whether we get the money before we borrow other money. I think it should be tabled until we see if we get stimulus money or not.

Mr. Sims – We put in a letter of interest. The application time frame, I believe was extended to August 25 – 2% of this money for energy efficiency is going to open competitive grants. It is going to be a long shot.

Mayor Zwelling – The stimulus money that we were given a lead on turned out to be for community's 200,000 and better. It is such a long shot, that it is not going to happen.

Mr. Tarbert – I am in favor of the lights at the stadium; I think this is a maintenance issue, I think it is a great idea. But if we approve this and find out in a month that we've received stimulus money, that we can no longer use. The application is in August?

Mr. Sims - We won't get any further information until late August. All I was able to submit was a letter of interest, so they are compiling their lists for the background. Most of the money, as the Mayor indicated was for entitlement community's which was cities much larger than ours and counties much more densely populated.

Mr. Tilton – If we approve this, we wouldn't start on the lights until after the season anyway, correct?

Mr. Sims – I guess Mr. Wolfe could help us there. I don't know how much down time he could afford during the summer.

Mr. Wolfe – The new poles are going to be put up separately and the existing lights are going to be working until the others are installed.

Mr. Sims – They wouldn't be in the same location – there is different spacing.

Mayor – I've talked with Musco Lighting many times about this and they are the ones that put the lighting in at Sulsberger; they could put it in, in a week.

Mr. Hennessey – So, if it passes as an emergency, you will be able to do quick enough; if it just goes with two-thirds, you are looking at 30 days.

Mr. Tilton – This \$185,000 is complete, 100% - everything?

Mayor – That includes the \$20,000 for the wiring.

Mr. Tarbert – I can't, with good conscience do this if we think there is a long shot here of getting free money for this project.

Mr. Tarbert moved to table for two months, seconded by Mr. Dittmar.

Mr. Mc Peek moved to amend by deleting Secrest Loading Dock - \$225,000, seconded by Mr. Tarbert.

Mr. Kunkle – It is interesting with Secrest and the Stadium because they were both built with Public Works money from Roosevelt. It has been a long hard struggle for all of you – thank you for coming down and seeing how we do operate. In these economic times it is very difficult to justify any expenditures. I had a call from the people who want to put on Cats – they wanted to know how we were doing with the loading dock – I said we still don't have it – they said okay, we will bring you Lord of the Dance, instead. That is a nice rental for us. Whatever you decide to help us with, we will make it work.

Mr. Tilton – The curtains – the last time we replaced them, was when?

Mr. Kunkle – 1986 – we never had conditioned air – it was either cold with humidity or hot with humidity – with conditioned air, we hope these will last a lot longer.

Mr. Case – If this does pass, are you going to have to take out a note, all by itself for \$60,000, when you just passed the other one and said you weren't adding anything to it.

Mr. Raines – It depends on the timing – down the road we are going to do a note for the stadium lights and for the skateboard park.

Mrs. Thomas – On Mr. Kilpatrick's paper it says rental for car one week, it is going to take a month.

Mr. Kilpatrick – The paperwork that was submitted to the City wasn't clear, it had an estimate for one week rental of the car, per day. I do remember at some point in time, Mrs. Thomas stating, that it could take as long as a month. I am not sure that I want to recommend that the offer pay for the entire month.

Mr. Tarbert – Mr. Hillis, can we submit a contingent ordinance that says up to \$2,500 contingent upon her submitting receipts for total rental car value.

Mr. Hillis – You can do that.

Mr. Tarbert – We could amend this to say – up to \$2,800, that we just pay her rental car rent, whatever that amount would be.

Mr. Hennessey – She is going to submit to the insurance company and this will be the left over.

Mr. Tarbert moved to amend 09-61 as amended, amended to include the total amount up to \$3,000; that would be subject to and limited by a complete receipt for the rental car, not to exceed a month. Whatever the rental car is, if it is a week and we pay the \$239.99; Mrs. Thomas can return the receipt, if it is two weeks, then it is \$500.00 or whatever it is, seconded by Mr. Tilton. Motion carried.

Mr. Dittmar moved for third reading and passage, as amended, seconded by Mr. Tarbert.
