Mr. Zakany – I was putting up signs in Putnam by the skateboard park and I counted 31 kids riding skateboards at about 7:00 in the evening. They use this park all the time, it is too bad we didn't pass the ordinance for the other skate park. I went through the Riverside Park and I looked at the boat docks and I didn't see anybody on that boat dock. We got \$54,000 and you don't see anybody taking advantage of them.

Mr. Vincent – The grant funds to help pay for about half of the \$68,000 for the Skate Park was an important part of getting the ordinance passed. I am hoping we get some grant money, next year to make that happen. The grant money was the important part of getting that passed. I do agree that these people do need some form of exercise. The youth that came here to talk before Council spoke well, were well behaved and presented themselves very well.

Mayor Zwelling – I disagree with you about the importance of the boat dock at Riverside, I think that was very important. The one that was there was half in the water. We tried for boat dock improvements at Zane Landing, where the Lorena is and at Riverside and they only gave us the Riverside because of the loan crunch. We were notified this week that we had been a grant of \$116,000 for re-decking existing docks, extension of dock and boat slips at Zane Landing by the Lorena. I think this is less than we had applied for but exciting news.
