

CITY COUNCIL MEETING – MONDAY, JULY 11, 2011

The Council of the City of Zanesville met in regular session at 7:00 p.m., Monday, July 11, 2011 in the City Council Chambers, 401 Market Street, Zanesville, Ohio.

Mr. Vincent led those present in the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Zakany moved to accept the minutes as printed, seconded by Mr. Tilton.

Mr. Tilton moved to add Ordinance No. 11-47 to the agenda as Item 1A, seconded by Mr. Baker.

Ordinance No. 11-46 – Introduced by Council – An ordinance authorizing the proper City official to file an application for assistance under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, subpart 1 – state's program: state administration of CDBG, entitlement funds, and authorizing the administration of the FY 2011 Formula Grant, and declaring an emergency.

Mr. Tilton moved to waive the three readings, seconded by Mr. Roberts.

Ordinance No. 11-47 - Introduced by Council – An ordinance authorizing the proper City official to advertise for bids and enter into contracts for the resurfacing of park entrance, one parking lot, and one basketball court at Jim Tucker Memorial Park; and Dillon Road, Dulty Lane and Davis Court in the East end neighborhood under the City's CDBG Formula 2010 Grant, and declaring an emergency.

Mr. Tilton moved to waive the three readings, seconded by Mr. Baker.

Mr. Roberts moved for passage, seconded by Mr. Baker.

Mr. Baker: What is the time frame for this?

Mrs. Clapper: We are hoping to have the construction complete by Thanksgiving when the asphalt plants close, but there is certainly the opportunity for us to extend that contract and perform it next year once the plants open up again.

Mr. Baker: Is that the reason for the declaration of the emergency?

Mrs. Clapper: Yes, because of the construction season this year. Mr. Saunders has been busy and he had a difficult time preparing the specs. He just finished them for us. That is why we brought it as an emergency hoping there would be an opportunity for the project to be completed this year rather than waiting until next year.

ORDINANCES FOR ACTION

Ordinance No. 11-44 – Introduced by Council – An ordinance authorizing the proper City official to advertise for bids and enter into a professional contract for hydrogen peroxide or bioxide for odor control at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Mr. Tilton moved for second reading, seconded Mr. Hutcheson.

Mr. Zakany: Is this one year?

Mr. Sims: It is up to three years. Some companies will not authorize a three year “locked in rate” but that is how it is going to be advertised. The contract will be between one and three years.

Mr. Tarbert: If we waive the readings on this would that speed you up to cut down on the odor any faster or are we still on a standard timeline?

Mr. Sims: Our contract with the current vendor does not expire until the first part of October. Their equipment is in place right now.

Ordinance No. 11-45 - Introduced by Council – An ordinance authorizing the Mayor to apply for and execute contracts in connection with the Round 26 State Issue I Program.

Mr. Hutcheson moved for second reading, second by Mr. Zakany.

MISCELLANEOUS AND UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Mayor Zwelling: I attended Lenny Ballas’ retirement event Saturday. He and his wife are moving away. This is significant to the city of Zanesville as he was instrumental in bringing Worthington Foods (now Kellogg’s) to Zanesville. When Worthington Foods expanded, they brought the plant to Zanesville. They had a plant in Worthington and it closed. The only Worthington Foods plant is in Zanesville. He was also solely responsible for bringing Economy Linen to Zanesville to service the hospitals. Both of these plants have grown and Kellogg’s finished a \$25 million expansion a few years ago. We wish Lenny Ballas and his wife the very best in his retirement and we thank him for his service to the city of Zanesville.

Saturday night “Feed My Sheep” is a special program and it stands to be an excellent concert. These are nationally known musicians that are to perform at Secrest Auditorium. Tickets are going pretty well, so I expect a good crowd.

The report on Secrest is you are going to hear about a number of concerts between now and the end of the year. They are being booked and there are some great acts planned for Secrest. I will keep you informed as the contracts are signed.
