The Council of the City of Zanesville met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, November 23, 2015 in the City Council Chambers, 401 Market Street, Zanesville, Ohio.

Mr. Vincent was absent.

Mr. Tarbert led those present in the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The following members of Council answered Roll Call: Mr. Hutcheson, Mr. Roberts, Ms. Gildow, Mr. Foreman, Mr. Tarbert, Mr. Baker, Mrs. Gentry, and Mrs. Norman. Mr. Sharrer and Mr. Vincent were absent.

Mr. Tarbert: Do we have a motion to excuse Mr. Sharrer and Mr. Vincent?

Ms. Gildow moved to excuse Mr. Vincent and Mr. Sharrer, please. Mr. Baker seconded the motion.

Mr. Tarbert: Is there any discussion? All in favor of excusing Mr. Vincent and Mr. Sharrer signify by saying aye.

All members present were in favor of excusing Mr. Sharrer and Mr. Vincent by voice vote. None present were opposed.

Mr. Tarbert: Is there any discussion from the members of Council? I will say this. I had a phone call today from someone who wanted us to table this. When I asked him his reasons for tabling it he was upset about another Ordinance and didn't give any reasons to table this Ordinance. But I told him I would pass that request along to Council. We also have a petition from Mr. Eric Jones. He is speaking for this Ordinance.

Mr. Eric Jones, 221 Luck Avenue, Zanesville, Ohio.

Mr. Jones: Hello everyone. I will real quickly and again this is going to be somewhat distorted and schizophrenic. The said that the last time I was here, I have no problem with many of the police officers. My question was I thought that this would have been a great opportunity for the women up there to discuss the police department not having the adequate number of women; or, any blacks what-so-ever. If you took a moment and said a few words about it something. It doesn't happen overnight. This is something that takes time. You end up with zero folks. You could have had this number in 1965. Fifty years later and we have worked our way up to zero again. So to start with a position that is not contradicted need not be proved. This is a fine argument to make believe it or not. Take a deep breath everybody. When I say this I am not speaking in a sense of humanity. I am speaking in the sense of ability. If the test is correct and over half for our police department or fire department or anything then if women can't do the job, then we are talking about women versus men, women are inferior to men. It is better, I am not going to just put this on women, and I will say black people too. If black people can't take the test, can do the what-you-call-it, and then guess what? Inferior. This is not about humanity. This is not that they are subhuman or anything like that. I am not saying anything like that. I am saying they lack the ability to be police officers. This is what you are telling your daughters. You would think that the women here would have said something before now. Again this doesn't happen overnight. I mean this is something the women should have been saying, the women councilors, should have been asking about this for the last ten years, eight years, I don't know how many you have been here but Connie has been asked about this for twenty years. Every year she should have said, how many women do we have here? How many blacks do we have here? And if we don't have the numbers ask why not. Now community against the community can say we all have responsibility and we do. I don't have a problem with

that. The ones that do have the actual responsibility, the ones that have to be able to make the numbers are the Safety Director, the Mayor, and the Police Chief. They have the actual need to bring those numbers up. I was going to give you some suggestions but I will do that later. I see I am going to run out of time but again this is something that I shouldn't be the one coming up here and doing this. I have something more important that I consider then this. This should be handled at a lower level. Thank you very much and I will see you in a few.

Mr. Tarbert: Is there any more discussion from Council? We will have the roll call on passage of 15-111.

Mr. Tarbert: We have a motion by Mr. Baker to insert the preposition for in the preamble after to apply (insert for) to be "to apply for and accept".

Mr. Baker: I would also like to move to put "to accept" if that is alright.

Ms. Gildow: Per the edit that does make it grammatically correct.

Mr. Tarbert: Is that anywhere else in the Ordinance? I don't have it in front of me.

Ms. Gildow: Yes, it is. Section One the same edit is needed.

Mr. Tarbert: We have a motion to amend 15-129 by Mr. Baker, seconded by Ms. Gildow, to apply in the heading "to apply for and to accept" an Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant. And then in Section One the same amendment, the proper City Official is hereby authorized to apply "for and to accept" the grant. Does everyone understand the proposed amendment? Is there any discussion? All those in favor of amending 15-129 signify by saying aye.

All present were in favor. None present were opposed.  
The Ordinance stands amended.

Mr. Hutcheson moved for first reading and it was seconded by Mr. Roberts.

Mr. Tarbert: Is there any discussion from Council? We do have a petition from Cyndi Royce, 1543 Ridge Avenue, Zanesville speaking against Ordinance 15-131.

Cyndi Royce: My problem with it is that we have pot holes, we have hookers, we have drugs, we don't have any jobs, and we have a higher poverty rate than people around us. We got a seven percent unemployment rate, we got abandoned houses everywhere, we have buildings that catch on fire and the rubble is still standing there. You guys say we don't have any money for all of this but all of a sudden you have money to raise your wages. I don't understand that. You have pot holes big enough you could lose cars in and no money to fix them. Hookers are everywhere. You ain't got no money to put into that problem. You have drugs everywhere and you ain't got any money to put on that problem either. Even though the police say they know where every drug house is, that is what they tell us when they come to our house. We know where everyone is but none of them are getting closed down. To jobs: McDonalds does not support a whole family. When people have to work two and three jobs and then their spouse has to work two or three jobs and then you have their kids working. We have a problem here. I know maybe on the north end that ain't what is happening but in my end of town that is what is happening. It is ridiculous. But you know, you guys can get a pay raise and they just keep working real hard. It doesn't make any sense. So I was wondering where you are going to get this money that you are going to use to raise your wages. Is it from the bill you passed the other day where the sixteen year olds have to pay taxes? You know, is that where you are getting the money from? It just doesn't make any sense to me. You don't know how to fix the things that really need fixed but raise your pay rates. I know we are only talking about eighty dollars probably, less than that in a whole year. But still, money is money.

Mr. Tarbert: Speaking as the Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee just a refresher. We had this come before Ways and Means and it was passed unanimously. The reason for this was we for the first time ever at least that I can remember we had an independent committee of people who weren't affiliated with the City in any way to take a look at this. They compared wages in the City to other cities or almost all cities across Ohio who were similarly situated. They put a lot of hard work and a lot of hours into this and came up with very specific recommendations. Most of them are just cost of living

increases that haven't happened for several years. I think we could probably have a member from the committee come speak at the next meeting if we wanted to, if we need that again. But again, that is up to Council. They have already taken their time to do the report. They have taken the time to come to Ways & Means and Ways & Means voted to unanimously pass this. So that is up to Council and I guess you can let Dan know after this meeting if you want someone from this committee to come back and speak.

Mr. Tarbert: Is there any other discussion on this Ordinance? All those in favor of first reading signify by saying aye?

All present were in favor. None present were opposed.

#### **PRIVATE PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS**

Mr. Eric Jones, 221 Luck Avenue, Zanesville, Ohio regarding police comments.

Mr. Jones: I thought I would take a minute to finish up if that is alright with everybody. Again I thought that was a soft fall and I thought one of the women up there would have said something about not wanting to be inferior to men or women not being able to be on the Police Department. I thought I would have got something; a comment or something from somebody. Here I thought I would take a moment that I would have said the community has responsibilities. Citizens and media should have been commenting on this for the last five years. Mr. Bennett, I am sure he’s got it as part of his twenty year

plan. Right? Increasing the diversity of the Police Department? No, yes, you can explain it later. I am not going to make a big deal out of it. As a suggestion folks, I mean, make it part of a one, or a five, or a ten year plan to increase diversity. That is not that big of a deal. Higher pay, you know. I understand you guys just tried to get higher pay and I don't know that it would make a difference but if we are not getting anyone are you allowed to pay women an extra bonus to be police officers? I don't know if that's possible or not. A finder's fee for finding women, good Lord, that would work in a bar folks. Something to increase the number of women on the police force and the number of blacks on the police force. I don't know of a bunch more suggestions, higher pay. The women officers that you do have are you sending them out to the schools? Let the kids see that maybe in twenty years they could be women police officers. It is a lot easier if you take women to a school than it is for you to take the men there and they see men and they say well, you have to be a man to be a police officer. This is not anything. This is not and again it is part of a long term plan. I don't see you changing this in the next year or so. I mean even if he does go full out, even if he does the Civil Service exam every year for the next whatever but I am thinking over the last ten years if you got one woman every year you would be up to at least twelve now. This is not like I am saying, hey guess what, but this is fifty years in the making. Title 7 was what 1965, 1964? Title 9 was 1975 or something like that. It is not like you know I am making a statement like that. I was sure a number of you would have at least commented on that. It is 2015, folks. It is not like I am sitting here in 1965 or 1975 or any of that this is something that we could have been able to do if it was higher on the priority list. Again, thank you very much.

Mr. Tarbert: We also had a petition filed on the wrong form and I think it was turned in late too by the same person and that person isn't here? So we will put those in the file. Is there anything else for Council?

Mr. Baker: Mr. President, I don't even know if this is possible but if there are representatives from the Muskingum Economic Opportunity Action Group here who wanted to speak before Council for the tabled motion. Can they be invited to do so during this time?

Mr. Tarbert: No. Not if it has been tabled.

Mr. Baker: Okay. That is all.

Mr. Hutcheson: Mr. President, I move we

Ms. Gildow: Mr. President: I would just like to remind people that the Miracle on Main Street is next week on Wednesday and I would encourage them to come down and see the beautiful decorations and all of the things going on in the downtown area. A lot of people have worked hard including our wonderful City workers who are putting up the lighted signs on the poles as we speak. It should be a good time. It costs nothing for people to come down and visit. It is generally a very good time and it should be prettier than ever this year. Thank you.

Mr. Tarbert: Thank you very much. Is there anything else?

Mr. Hutcheson: I make a motion that we adjourn.



Elected Official Wage Committee Recommendations  
September 1, 2015

**Committee Members:** Steve Randles, Paul Hill, Karen Spriegel, Phil Newman, Steve Baldwin

**Objective:** We as a committee were tasked with analyzing the city of Zanesville's elected officials' compensation as compared to elected officials in cities of comparable government form, population and economic factors.

**Recommendations:**

**Mayor:** We recommend the current salary stay the same but add a 1.7% cost of living raise for the next three years beginning in 2016.

**President of Council:** The committee recommends that Council President receive a \$635 raise January 1, 2016 and then a 1.7% cost of living raise for the years 2017 and 2018.

**Council:** We recommend a \$414 raise for each council member on January 1, 2016 and then a 1.7% cost of living raise in 2017 and 2018. The members of the committee all agree that to retain and attract quality people for council they must compensate them.

**Law Director:** This committee recommends the current salary stay the same but add a 1.7% cost of living raise for each of the next three years beginning in 2016.

**Auditor:** We recommend the Auditor receive an initial \$1933 raise in salary as of January 1, 2016 along with an additional 1.7% cost of living raise in 2016, 2017, and 2018.

**Treasurer:** We recommend that the current salary stay the same with the addition of a 1.7% cost of living raise for each of the next three years beginning in 2016.

**Further Recommendations:**

**Law Director:** The committee strongly recommends that council give consideration in the next four years to making this an office with one full-time law director and one part-time assistant law director. We believe this would allow city officials better access to the law director; encourage consistency in decision making; and ultimately reduce the cost of legal advice to the city.

**Auditor and Treasurer:** After review of comparable jurisdiction, the members of this committee recommend that a study be done in the next four years on the duties and responsibilities of these two positions. We feel that the current auditor's salary is not commensurate with the potential legal ramifications, responsibilities, liability, and required knowledge. We also recommend that council, after reviewing the responsibilities and duties of the treasurer's office, give consideration to whether this position should be a full-time position or a part-time position.

THIS TAX INCREMENT SERVICE PAYMENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into as of this \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2015 by and between the City of Zanesville, an Ohio municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), and ARS Property Acquisitions, an Ohio limited liability company (hereinafter referred to as the "Developer"), under the following circumstances:
