

ORDINANCE NO. 19 - 81
INTRODUCED BY COUNCIL

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIAL TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH BEST EQUIPMENT FOR THE PURCHASE AND OUTFITTING OF A 2019 MOBILE TRANSIT CAMERA VAN T-250 THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM FOR THE WASTEWATER DIVISION.

WHEREAS, the City's Wastewater Division has a sewer camera which is essential in detection of issues in the sanitary and storm sewer systems, and for use in designing Combined Sewer Overflow investments; and

WHEREAS, the City's current camera vehicle is an older ambulance, which is over 30 years old and was never designed for the purposes of its current use; and

WHEREAS, Best Equipment is listed on the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program for the vendor of a 2019 Transit Van and has a Transit MEPS Build package that would install the desk, monitors, cabling, and other appurtenances inside the van, accommodating better and longer term use of the camera systems.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Zanesville, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION ONE: The proper City official is hereby authorized to purchase a 2019 Ford Transit Van T-250 from Best Equipment through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program, Contract No. 800566.

SECTION TWO: The proper City official is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement and expend funds with Best Equipment for the installation of MEPS Build package into the 2019 Transit Van.

SECTION THREE: The cost for this 2019 Ford Transit Van T-250 and MEPS Build Package is estimated to be \$80,000 and shall be paid from the following line items in the following amounts:

ORDINANCE NO. 19- 82
INTRODUCED BY COUNCIL

**AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 1151 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES
OF THE CITY OF ZANESVILLE REGARDING LANDSCAPING AND SCREENING**

WHEREAS, the current version of Chapter 1151 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Zanesville was drafted over 30 years ago; and

WHEREAS, through a comprehensive review of the Planning and Zoning Code, the Community Development Department has identified areas that require amending and/or updating; and

WHEREAS, according to Section 1117.01, "To adapt to changing development conditions and provide for the phased implementation of the City Comprehensive Plan, the Planning Commission may from time to time recommend, and Council may adopt, amendments to the provisions of the text of this Zoning Code ... as provided by the Ohio Revised Code"; and

WHEREAS, proper notification of the intent of this proposed legislation was given in a newspaper of general circulation; and

WHEREAS, after taking testimony and discussion, the Zanesville Planning Commission has recommended to City Council that proposed amendments to Chapter 1151 be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Zanesville, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION ONE: Existing Chapter 1151, titled "Landscaping and Screening" of the Codified Ordinances, contained in Title Five, as shown in the attached Exhibit A, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION TWO: A new Chapter 1151, titled "Landscaping and Screening" as shown in the attached Exhibit B, incorporated as if fully rewritten herein, is hereby enacted, and shall replace the former Chapter 1151.

SECTION THREE: It is found that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including §121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the Rules of this Council.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
