ORDINANCE NO. 19- 95

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ACCEPT AN
APPALACHIAN REGIONAL COMMISSION GRANT FOR THE DOWNTOWN
FIBER OPTIC NETWORK.

WHEREAS, the City identified a need for higher speed broadband in the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, the City performed preliminary engineering on fiber optic in the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, the City applied for grant funding from Appalachian Regional Commission and has been notified that the City's application has been approved for award in the amount of \$138,350; and

WHEREAS, the City is required to match the grant in an equal amount, which has been budgeted in the FY2019 City Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Zanesville, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute all documents accepting an Appalachian Regional Commission grant in the amount of \$138,350 and hereby authorizes \$163,350 of City funds as a match to said grant.

ORDINANCE NO. 19- 96

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIAL TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH COMPUCORP AS THE INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDER FOR ZANESVILLE DOWNTOWN FIBEROPTIC NETWORK.

WHEREAS, through the Cool & Connected process, a need for higher speed broadband in the downtown area was identified; and

WHEREAS, the City performed preliminary engineering on fiber optic in the downtown area and applied for grant funding from Appalachian Regional Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City advertised for an Internet Service Provider and selected CompuCorp as the partner; and

WHEREAS, the City and CompuCorp have finalized the proposed network, amount of bandwidth and pricing needed for the public facilities and finalized terms and conditions of the partnership.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Zanesville, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The proper City official is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services contract with CompuCorp in substantially the same form as Exhibit A to this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect upon the approval of the Mayor and from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**Zanesville Fiber & Wireless Project
Project Understanding**

4/12/2019
Version 2.0

1. Government Building Internet Access

- a. Provide access to the CoZ government buildings:
 - i. Secrest Auditorium
 - ii. City Hall
 - iii. Public Safety Center
 - iv. Annex
 - v. Provide access to 5 nodes
- b. Term of internet connectivity (renewable 5-year terms)
- c. Monthly payment - included with 300 & 50 MB internet agreement
- d. Bandwidth allocation. (350 MB total. 300 MB x300 MB to City Buildings, and the 50MB to Public WiFi network.)
- e. Service level agreement - will be provided as an Exhibit to the contract.
- f. IP address space – one public IP address per building and one for the public wireless network. Additional IP addresses available upon request.

2. Fiber Network Deployment to City of Zanesville buildings

- a. Scope of work - 48 strand minimum to each of 5 nodes.
- b. Cost of project - see proposal.
- c. Milestone dates – TBD.
- d. Support - we will provide backup support to Zanesville's I.T. Department for an hourly rate.
- e. Hardware warranty - 1 year warranty in most cases. We will order and replace hardware and reconfigure it under warranty.
- f. Hardware replacement responsibility out of warranty – Zanesville, with CompuCorp's assistance for an hourly rate.
- g. Payment schedule - TBD, but partial payment up front and then draws as pieces are completed.
- h. Fiber specifications - single mode between Secrest and the city buildings.
- i. Node locations - see map
- j. City of Zanesville obligations - connect all conduit together so we can extend fiber across Main Street and bridge other gaps where fiber needs to run. Run conduit to each city building that needs to be connected.
- k. CompuCorp obligations - run all fiber, configure all hardware, do initial setup of network. Zanesville to maintain their networks after the initial setup, but we will support on an hourly basis after initial installation or as changes are needed.

- t. Bandwidth caps that are time based and will expire and ban for a period of time. Start this off with restrictive settings to minimize abuse and provide incentives to purchase a commercial account.

4. Dark fiber lease and revenue sharing

- a. Scope of work - TBD by CompuCorp. Will need buildout to each customer, and have renewable contract terms to help support cost of buildout.
- b. Revenue sharing model specifications - 20% of billed Monthly Recurring Revenue (less taxes) from each installed client will be credited to Zanesville against their bandwidth costs.
- c. Term of lease – Renewal 10-year term with 6-month notice.
- d. Support - CompuCorp to support all their commercial internet clients
- e. CompuCorp Exclusivity
 - i. Exclusivity to customers utilizing City of Zanesville Dark Fiber during construction phase (for up to two years from start of construction).
- f. Ramifications of dark fiber lease terminations and how it would affect existing customers.
 - i. If the initial 10 year dark fiber lease agreement is not renewed, with at least 6 month notice, the agreement will be converted into a straight dark fiber lease by the City of Zanesville to CompuCorp on the number of dark fiber strands in use for the commercial accounts that CompuCorp will be servicing.
