

under June you are looking at a bill of about \$3,668.65. Maybe you would be looking at \$3,237.20. These are negotiable prices, but we have to negotiate before the end of the year and I can have our lawyer at Porter-Wright Morris and Arthur work with Mr. Tarbert, the City attorney, and myself to negotiate terms on this, but we have to know that the City is willing to do so because essentially I have no recourse come January 1.

Mr. Roberts: Well, Mr. Reiter, I would say that this is probably most suited to the Public Service Committee. I would suggest that you forward whatever information you have over to Mr. Bennett. He will get it before the committee and they will dive into it and see where we have to go from there.

Mr. Reiter: Thank you. I think we have plenty of time to work through this and get some type of legislation through Council.

Mr. Roberts: Any and all information that you have, even the stuff behind the information that you gave us tonight would be very beneficial to that committee when they work through to figure out what we are going to look at doing.

Mr. Reiter: That is the thing of it. You can see that with the pricing structures they fluctuate. They have tended to fluctuate down every month on the price of commodities that are processed at that facility so every month we may be looking at an up or down if the markets start to raise the City's cost goes down as does the Waste Districts. It is just adjusted on your percentage of a whole. That is just through one facility which is the one outside of Zanesville.

Mr. Roberts: We will take a look at it and we will see what we can get turned around for you.

Mr. Reiter: Thank you very much and good bye, Mr. Bennett. Thank you.

Mr. Roberts: If there are no other speakers and we have no private petitions or communications. Is there anything from the Administration tonight?

Mr. Foreman: I have one thing. I would just like to thank everyone for their support they gave to a Day in the Dog House which was on September 21. Several people participated including myself. I was able to raise \$1,220 for the Animal Shelter and overall we raised in excess of \$8,000 on that day so it was very successful. So, thanks to everyone in the community.

Mr. Roberts: Is there anything else from Council?

Mrs. Osborn moved to adjourn and it was seconded by Miss Bradshaw. A voice vote was taken with all being in favor. None were opposed. Motion carries. The meeting adjourned about 7:18 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIAL TO PURCHASE A NEW CASE 580 SUPER N BACKHOE FROM SOUTHEASTERN EQUIPMENT CO. INC. FOR THE WATER DIVISION THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City staff has examined the current condition of the Water Division's heavy equipment and has determined that an existing backhoe has reached its useful life expectancy and must be replaced; and

WHEREAS, the Division leadership has researched various models and has determined that replacing the existing unit with a similar Case model provides standardization for on hand parts; and

WHEREAS, Capital monies were appropriated for equipment purchases within the FY 2019 City Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Zanesville, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The proper City official is hereby authorized to purchase a new Case 580 Super N Backhoe from Southeastern Equipment Co. for the Water Division through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Program.

SECTION 2: The cost for this new excavator is estimated to be \$85,000.00, and shall be paid from line item number 609-5475-54448.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall take effect upon the approval of the Mayor and from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
