- Keep the curb area in front of your house clean and free of debris

Saving For a Rainy Day

Have you ever noticed all of the water that runs on the street during a hard rain or storm? Do you know where this water goes?

This water is called runoff, and it flows into a drain that is part of the City's sewer system.

To keep the main sewer from becoming overloaded, rain water flows into nearby creeks or streams.

It Goes With the Flow

The problem is that much of the debris and garbage lying on the street is also washed into the storm drain, creating a pollution problem, and endangering fish and other aquatic life.
